As the cast performs "Prepare Ye The Way Of The Lord," "Learn Your Lessons Well," "All For The Best," "All Good Gifts," "Turn Back, O Man" and "By My Side," the parables of Jesus Christ come humanly and hearteningly to life.

Where to Get Tickets: Tickets are available by reservation only. You may reserve and pay for your tickets in person at ***Gambles Hardware*** in downtown Caro during regular business hours or reserve your tickets via email at info@tacfta.org. **All tickets must be paid for in advance unless reservations are made within three days of a performance, at which time they will be held for you at the door.**

Your tickets will be mailed to you one week before the show regardless of the date we received your reservation. Please provide us with a self-addressed, stamped envelope so that your ticket order will not be delayed.

Seating Arrangements: Our seating charts and ticket processing are done completely by hand. Seating arrangements give preference to TACA Members by level, then to Cast, then to the general public. Due to the nature of this process, we ask that **if you plan to sit with another party, please put your reservation under ONE NAME and use ONE CHECK OR CASH.** This will eliminate any confusion. If you add people to your reservation after we have received it, your seating placement may change. **Once tickets have been issued, the sale is final and**

non-transferrable. Seats have a table letter and seat number. Please note that if your tickets have different letters, it does not mean that you will not be seated together. Example: Seats A4 and B1 are next to each other, while seats A8 and B5 are directly across from them, respectively.
